

Prayers for Ukraine

The wall display case near the church office contains a special Lenten display, installed in cooperation with the Fine Arts Committee. Honoring the people of Ukraine, it features a collection of "Pysanky," the type of decorated eggs that are unique to the Ukrainian people. The motifs "drawn" on these eggs with wax include prayerful symbols of hope, faith, and peace. Ancient legend says that as long as Pysanky are made, goodness will prevail over evil. This display offers prayers of hope and peace for the people of Ukraine.
