Why peace cranes? Sadako Sasaki was two years old when she survived the atomic bombing of Hiroshima, although she soon developed leukemia. In the ten years she lived, she began to fold origami paper cranes – symbols of peace. In a few short weeks, the season of Advent will be upon us. As that time begins to enfold us, let us fold 1000 cranes to honor the one we call Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
