NOW ON DISPLAY: THE RAINMAKERS NEW ART EXHIBIT

"The Rainmakers," the Fine Arts Committee's unique new exhibition, is now on display in the West Hall, the Thompson case and the Kiosk located in the East Hall, adjacent to the Rotunda. This unique exhibit features the work of Guillermo Delgado and a variety of Community Engagement Students from the MSU Residential College in the Arts and Humanities as well as a number of incarcerated individuals from throughout Mid-Michigan. The exhibit grew out of the artist's Prison Poetry & 'Zine Project, which mounts poetry and art workshops in six different Michigan correctional facilities, including the juvenile detention center in Lansing. Guillermo teaches in prisons a few times a week. The goal of the project is to help make incarcerated folks feel more human again by providing a safe and encouraging venue for self-expression. Guillermo is an Academic Specialist in Community and Socially Engaged Arts and Humanities at Michigan State University. He will talk about "The Rainmakers" and his work on the Prison Poetry & 'Zine Project during the Peoples Forum in the Robertson Room on November 24, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. The exhibit will remain on display through January 16, 2020.
