

Update: Stephen Ministry Training

Stephen Ministry is a lay ministry that provides Christian caregiving to church members going through difficult times. Despite the limitations that COVID-19 has placed on meeting together, it still looks like we could have a group of Stephen Ministers trained at the church by the end of this fall. By attending a series of 20 zoom sessions of an hour each and reading pages and pages of leadership training materials, Aram Kabodian plans to be trained as a Stephen Leader by the end of August. The first group of Stephen Ministers would begin training (probably a hybrid of face-to-face and zoom meetings) in October. By God's grace and your prayers, we hope to have the program in place by mid-winter.
