

WEEKDAY SCHOOL AGE PROGRAM CONTINUES INTO FALL

We are excited to announce that our School Age program will continue into this fall.

The program takes place in the Youth Den. Those students attending summer camp now, will be able to stay, if desired, and new students will be added to the roster as space allows.

Students will be limited to small group sizes and will be able to work on online school work while in the School Age Program. Families are welcome to send in a laptop or tablet as well as head phones or other personal school supplies if desired.

All students and staff will wear masks throughout the day except when eating, drinking, exercising (when 6 feet apart outside) or when taking a short break alone in a designated area of the classroom.

The daily schedule will consist of periods of outdoor activity, STEM experiences, and morning and afternoon time designated to completing assigned online work. Staff members will provide time, a clean space, and guidance to students, K-3, that are capable of focusing on work assigned by their elementary school.

If you are interested in enrolling your school-age student this fall, on a full or part-time basis, please contact the Preschool Office. We will be happy to provide you with an application for enrollment and a Guidelines for Attending School During a Pandemic document.
